KEEPING UP WITH THE BOARD

You will remember, as part of the preparation for the annual HOA meeting in early November, voting information to purchase additional package boxes to have installed at the Lazy River Lane entrance was sent out and approved. As discussed at the annual meeting, Phil Teagarden and Jim Carr were working on repairing the existing unusable boxes and had at that time, fixed 4 of them. Following the meeting, an additional 3 were restored back to usable condition. Even though this project was approved and the additional assessment bills for purchase of these boxes were sent out to our land and homeowners, the Board is reconsidering this expenditure.

After the restoration of 7 boxes, we went through the Christmas season with very little return to the post office and most days we have restored boxes that are not even being used. The return of packages that we did see was due to the size of the items trying to be delivered and that would not be eliminated with the purchase of additional boxes. The Board is trying to be considerate with your money and yet attentive to your concerns. Please let us know your thoughts by emailing the office (riversedge@ellijay.com). REMINDERS FROM THE BOARD

It has come to the Board's attention that people in our community think we have a River's Edge Facebook page. We do not, nor have we been approached by anyone to ask if we should have one. So, whatever is out there, is totally the opinions of whomever posted on the site and is not sanctioned by the Association!

***As springs starts to sprout around us and there is an increase in tourists, please remember that SHORT TERM RENTALS are prohibited in River's Edge Estates. Minimum rentals of 6 (six) months or more are allowed. Anyone engaged in short term rentals will be fined up to \$500 per day.

***New construction, addition/changes to existing home/garage, landscaping, changing the outside home color, etc must be approved by the Architectural Committee. If you have any questions as to whether you need approval, please contact the Architectural Committee consisting of Dave Schmitt, Jim Carr and Esther Lax and they will be glad to help you. For the approval forms that need to be filled out for your projects, please contact Linda at the HOA Office.

***Road Impact Fees: Just a reminder when evaluating your spring projects, as of January 1, 2022, the road impact fee was updated to include large renovations along with new constructions. This includes the addition to a home or garage and could include large yard work if heavy trucks and equipment come in to do the work as the large equipment will degrade our roads.

***Please remember that when walking our dogs around the neighborhood, they need to be on a leash. This is not an "optional" suggestion as some may think, it is part of our covenants, as is cleaning up after our dogs, including in common areas. Cleaning up after our dogs is just being a considerate neighbor to those who also walk the neighborhood for exercise. If you have a dog walker, please inform them of these rules.

Probably a lot of you know that we had an unfortunate incident in January during one of the storms. A dead tree fell upon one of our homes resulting in a gapping hole in the roof. Observant neighbors alerted Linda at the HOA Office and the homeowners were contacted immediately. As this was their second home, they were able to come to Ellijay that day, remove the tree, cover the hole and start contacting people to do the repairs. In retrospect, it would be prudent for all of us to inspect our properties and have any dead, diseased or injured trees removed. Should you have any questions, the Architectural Committee will be glad to answer your questions.

Even though we are tired of the cold and drizzle, winter is not quite over yet! Please continue to be diligent about protecting your outside spigots and pipes and you may want to let your faucets dip a little during an extended freeze. Make sure your heating system continues to be in good working condition and that you have adequate propane for your generator in case we lose power. If you are away from your home for several days or this home is your second home, make sure your thermostat is set to 50 degrees or above. During this last severe cold spell in January, authorities said to have your thermostat set at 70! Whatever temperature you choose, have your cupboards open where your water pipes are located to give them extra protection. And remember that if the electricity goes out, so does our water. You may want to have extra water ready for drinking water and toilets. Another reminder that our electricity is on the same grid as the county jail and therefore we are one of the first in the county to be worked on—but it still gets cold waiting for them to fix it!!
